

Discover Bulloo Shire

- Bulloo Shire is a predominantly rural area with the main focus of activity and population in the town of Thargomindah, and further towns of Hungerford and Noccundra.
- The agricultural output in Bulloo Shire is sheep, wool, beef and honey, while the mining industry focuses on oil, natural gas and opals.
- A hub of energy and resources activity, Bulloo Shire is home to camps for the oil and gas industry.
- Construction starts soon on a "spagazing" centre, with an aspiration to expand further into a wellness centre and a range of complementary services. This catalytic new development is located near to another gamechanger for its time, the oldest artesian hydro power station in Australia.
- Right at the edge of the cornerstone of SWQ, Bulloo Shire borders New South Wales and South Australia, and is a major stopping point for tourists including "grey nomads" as they explore the many attractions the region has to offer, including the Burke and Wills Dig Tree, Cameron Corner and Currawinya National Park.

- Ready for growth, the primary school has recently been expanded.
- Bulloo Shire Council has solar panels installed on 100% of its Thargomindah buildings making it the "greenest little town in the west".
- An injection of \$1.78m Federal Government funds into an expanded Independent Living Centre means the social fabric of Bulloo Shire continues to be strengthened.
- Bulloo Shire sits at the forefront of ethical and organic sheep and cattle production, with some of the world's best organic beef at OBEOrganic farms, and productive fertile ewes at Picarilli Merinos. Kidman, one of Australia's largest beef producers, has three locations within Bulloo Shire, totalling over 16,000km², and a head capacity of 33,000.

Discover our Accessibility	 Thargomindah airport is integrated within the regional air network with flights to Brisbane, Toowoomba and St George. Well-maintained roads provide convenient access across the region to Quilpie and Cunnamulla, and interstate to NSW and SA. Digital connectivity rivals SEQ, and with recent investment in the latest infrastructure, fast and reliable internet is built-in to Bulloo Shire. Water availability through artesian sources means there is greater flexibility to location choice.

Housing	Opportunities to coordinate housing construction across the region and develop ready-to-build lots.
Energy	Prospect to franchise with a successful energy construction company with wholesale agreements in place with major clients. Feasibility to apply microgrid to Thargomindah with land incentives.
Small business	 New planned retail and small business space within Thargomindah, where small businesses could thrive and take advantage of the town's expanding tourist season. Opportunity to provide daycare or home daycare provision, with the potential to partner to explore building new facilities. Various opportunities for artisan businesses including oil distilling, native plants, beekeeping. Sub-regional demand for bakery. Premises could be in Thargomindah with regional distribution.
Horticulture	Modular or containerised food production could be brought to Bulloo Shire, with the potential to use existing (empty) return flights to Adelaide, as well as selling to the local energy industry camps. Land and primary treated water is available to service the use.
Tourism	 With a "spagazing" centre coming soon, and a range of established tourism product within the region, there is opportunity to further capitalise on the visitor economy: Providing temporary accommodation for events, in the form of a "tent city" or similar presents an excellent opportunity. With Bulloo Shire's broad range of tourism attractions, there is a gap for a package tour operator, that could stitch together the stories that interweave through the region. In Bulloo Shire and across the sub-region, there is an opening for a 4WD car hire company, with possible support from council to make this happen. Packaging and organising Station Stays to meet growing demand.
Technology	In the wide-open spaces of Bulloo Shire there's plenty of room to think big, from aerospace, aviation, and drone trials to agtech.
